<u>Christyn Davidson – Class of 2011</u>

Christyn, a four-year three-sport varsity athlete at Wilson High School, was a member of the field hockey, swim (2008), indoor track (2009 - 2011), and soccer teams. During her tenure, the field hockey team won three County Championships, was a District qualifier four years, and a State qualifier three years. Christyn was recognized as Berks County Player of the Year, Division I Most Valuable Player, and an All-American. Additionally, she earned first team honors on the All-Berks County Team, All-Region (MidEast) Team and the Pennsylvania All-State Team, as well as the Berks County, Pennsylvania and National All-Academic teams. In her senior year, Christyn served as Captain and finished 9th in County scoring and 1st in Wilson scoring. As a swimmer, Christyn helped the team to a League and District Championship, and she qualified for Districts in the 200 Meter Individual Medley and 200 Meter Backstroke. As a member of the soccer team, Christyn was a Captain (2011) and earned All-Division I 1st Team, and the team won a Berks County Championship, finished as the County runner-up, and qualified for the District tournament three years and for State tournament in one. Christyn also was the Berks County Athlete of the Year in 2011. Christyn continued her field hockey career at University of Connecticut (UConn). There, she was a four-year starter and Captain during her junior spring season and senior fall season. During her four years, UConn went to three NCAA Final Four Tournaments and four Big East Championships. The Huskies won three Big East Regular Season Championships and three Tournament Championships. In Christyn's junior year, in the NCAA Tournament semi-final game, UConn defeated University of North Carolina after two overtimes and a penalty shootout. Christyn's penalty shootout solidified the victory, and the Huskies then defeated Duke University 2-0 to win the 2013 NCAA National Championship. In 2014, the team beat Syracuse University 1-0 to win the 2014 NCAA National Championship. During her career, Christyn earned All-American, All-Region, and All-Big East honors and was nominated for NCAA Women of the Year Award. In 2014, Christyn was named to the USA National Team. Later, Christyn played in the Premier League in England and in 2020, she was named the Assistant Field Hockey Coach at her alma mater, the University of Connecticut.

Kevin Ford – Class of 2003

Kevin Ford led Wilson High to 3 state championship water polo teams during his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. He was named Berks County MVP during his senior season and he earned First Team All-State, All-American, and was named "Mr. Water Polo" Pennsylvania during his senior season. In addition, he earned Second Team All-State and Second Team All-American his junior season. During his successful four years on the Wilson swim team, his teams went 50-0, won the conference championship and the District 3 championship all four years and won two state PIAA state titles. He was 8 time swimming All-American and 8 time PIAA District 3 gold medalist. At one time, he held the school and/or pool records in the 50 and 100 freestyle and as a member of all three relay teams. His teams never lost a dual meet his entire four years of high school. He also swam the butterfly leg of the state record setting medley relay during his junior season in 2001, which was the men's first ever state championship team. In college, he earned a full scholarship to swim at the University of Maryland where he swam for two seasons while earning his bachelor's degree in Kinesiology. Kevin is a personal trainer in Washington D.C. and proud husband and dad to two little girls.

Ali (Miller) Javier - Class of 2009

Ali (Miller) Javier, was a four-year starter in soccer. In 2008 and 2009, Ali was named Reading Eagle Player of the Year for soccer, making her the first two-time selection in the county. She was named BCIAA All-Division in 2006-2009, All-Berks in 2007-2009, First-Team All-State in 2008 and 2009, and NSCAA First-Team All-Region in 2008 and 2009. She holds the Wilson record for Career Goals Scored at 73 goals and helped lead her team to 4 County Championship Games, earning two titles in 2006 and 2008, a District III Championship Title in 2008, and various rounds of the PIAA state tournament. She

was selected as team captain in 2009. Ali was also a two-year varsity letter-winner in field hockey in 2005 and 2006. Ali earned a scholarship to play soccer for the University of Delaware where she was four-year starter and a 3-time team-leading goal scorer, setting the school record for Most Goals in a Season in 2011 at 14 goals. She was named All-CAA Preseason First Team in 2012, CAA All-Tournament Team in 2011, First Team All-CAA in 2011 and 2012, NSCAA Third-Team All-Region in 2011, and was named UD Alumni Association Most Valuable Player in 2012. She was also a 3-Time CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recipient, as well as a 3-Time CAA Player of the Week. Ali graduated in 2013 from the University of Delaware with a degree in Spanish Education.

<u>Travis Mosser – Class of 2003</u>

Travis Mosser, class of 2003. He was awarded the Stewart Gehris Memorial Scholarship for Outstanding Track and Football Athlete. He received a total of 9 varsity letters for football, track and field, and winter track. He was named first team Lancaster Lebanon League linebacker 2003. Participated in the Berks and Lancaster Lebanon League all star games and was awarded 1st team All Berks and All District honors. On the track, he was named All County sophomore, junior and senior year. All District junior and senior year, and received All State honors his senior year. His 100 meter dash time of 10.89 seconds is still a top five time in Wilson High School history. He holds the Berks County Junior High 100 meter dash record at 11.30 seconds. In 2003, his 4x100 meter relay team set the school and county record. This record stood for over 15 years. They were the first Berks County relay team to make it to the Championship of America at the Penn Relays. He was also a record setting weight lifter. His four lift total of 1380 pounds made him the strongest 165-181 pound athlete in Wilson High School history. A record that still stands today.

Hilary Yoh - Class of 2012

As a 3-sport athlete, Hilary earned 11 varsity letters and appeared in 11 county championship games winning 6. She was Wilson's Outstanding Senior Female Athlete and top 5 finalist for Reading Eagle's Athlete of the Year. As senior captain and leading scorer in basketball, she received the Catherine E. Rhoads Award as the county's outstanding girls' player, Reading Berks Old Timers Athletic/Academic Scholarship, 3 Point Goal Scholarship, Wilson's Holiday Tournament MVP, 1st Team All Berks and All Academic. The basketball teams were County Champs and 3-time runners-up, district runner-up and final 8 in state. Hilary picked up a lacrosse stick for the first time in 9th grade and became a 3-time 1st team All Berks pick, 2012 All County MVP Attack, team captain, 2011 Berks' Leading Goal Scorer and, at the time, Wilson's All-Time Scorer with 206 goals. Wilson's lacrosse teams celebrated 3 County Championships and a runner-up. In field hockey, she was a team captain, All Academic and received Berks 1 Honorable Mention. The field hockey teams won 2 County Championships and a runner-up. After graduating in 2012, Hilary completed a post-grad year at The Hill School where she was named 1st Team All Mid Atlantic Prep and Team MVP for both basketball and lacrosse. She was the lacrosse team's season leading scorer. Hilary continued her basketball career at Lebanon Valley College where, as a senior captain, she led her team in points per game and was named 1st Team All Mid Atlantic Conference. Hilary graduated in 2017 with a degree in Business Administration.
